1Concerning the times and dates, brothers, there is no need to write to you, 2for you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. 3When people are saying, "Peace and security," destruction will suddenly come on them, like labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will certainly not escape. 4But you, brothers, are not in the dark so that this day takes you by surprise like a thief, 5for you are all sons of the light and sons of the day. We do not belong to the night or the darkness. 6So then let us not sleep like everyone else, but rather let us remain alert and sober.


7To be sure, those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. 8But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. 9You see, God did not appoint us for wrath, but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. 10He died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. 11Therefore, encourage one another and build each other up, just as you are also doing.

Come out to meet him!' 7Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. 8The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil because our lamps are going out.' 9But the wise answered, 'No, there may not be enough for us and for you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.' 10But while they were away buying oil, the bridegroom came. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding banguet, and the door was shut. 11Later, the other virgins also came and said, 'Lord, Lord, let us in.' 12But he answered, 'Amen I tell you: I do not know you.' 13Therefore, keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour."
