Lord's Supper - is celebrated today. Our Savior gives us his body and blood along with the bread and wine for our forgiveness in this Blessed Sacrament. Because he also wants us to examine ourselves prior to communing (1 Corinthians 11:23-29), and that those who commune with one another be united in doctrine and practice (1 Corinthians 10:16-17; Romans 16:1-17; 2 John 9-11), we respectfully ask that those who are members of Emmaus, or members of congregations in fellowship with the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, commune with us this morning. If you are not a member and would like to join us for communion, please speak with Pastor Else, so we can set up a time to study what God's Word has to say to us concerning Lord's Supper and church fellowship. First Lesson - Genesis 11:1-9

The whole earth had one language and a single vocabulary. As people traveled in the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar, and they settled there. 3They said to one another, "Come, let's make bricks and bake them thoroughly." They used mud brick instead of stone for building material, and they used tar for mortar. 4They said, "Come, let's build a city for ourselves and a tower whose top reaches to the sky, and let's make a name for ourselves, so that we will not be scattered abroad over the face of the whole earth." 5The LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the people were building. 6The LORD said, "If this is the first thing they are doing as one people, who all have one language, then nothing that they intend to do will be too difficult for them. 7Come, let's go down there and confuse their language, so that they cannot understand one another's speech." 8So the LORD scattered them from there over the face of the whole earth, and they stopped building the city. 9It was named Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of the whole earth. From there the LORD scattered them over the face of the whole earth.

Second Lesson - Acts 2:1-13

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2Suddenly a sound like the rushing of a violent wind came from heaven, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3They saw divided tongues that were like fire resting on each one of them. 4They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, since the Spirit was giving them the ability to speak fluently. 5Now there were godly Jewish men from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem, 6When this sound was heard, a crowd came together and was confused, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. 7They were completely baffled and said to each other, "Look, are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? 8Then how is it that each of us hears them speaking in his own native language? 9Parthians, Medes, and Elamites: residents of Mesopotamia, and of Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, 10Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Libya around Cyrene; visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes; 11Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring in our own languages the wonderful works of God." 12They were all amazed and perplexed. They kept saying to one another, "What does this mean?" 13But others mocked them and said, "They are full of new wine."


Gospel - John 14:23-31

23Jesus answered him, "If anyone loves me, he will hold on to my word. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. 24The one who does not love me does not hold on to my words. The word that you are hearing is not mine, but it is from the Father who sent me. 25"I have told you these things while staying with you. 26But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything I told you. 27"Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, and do not let it be afraid. 28You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would be glad that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. 29"I have told you now before it happens so that, when it does happen, you may believe. 30I will not speak with you much longer, because the ruler of this world is coming. He has no power over me. 31But I want the world

to know that I love the Father and that I am doing exactly what the Father has instructed me. "Get up. Let's leave this place."

<u>Voters' Meeting and Board Elections</u> - On June 11 we will have our quarterly Voters' Meeting and also elections for the boards that are responsible for the faithful stewardship of the gifts God has given our congregation.

Let us continue to give ourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because we know our labor in the Lord is not in vain.

Morning Aide & Afternoon Extended Care Positions at Emmaus - Emmaus is looking to hire 2 individuals for the 2017-2018 school year. The first position is for an aide in the PreK classroom Monday - Friday from 8:00 am - 12:45 pm. This person will be asked to monitor students in the classroom, set up and clean up of snack, art, etc. They will get students who stay for aftercare started on lunch and do some cleaning after lunch is started. The second position is in Extended Care in the afternoon from 3:00-5:30 PM or until the last student is picked up, Monday through Friday on. This person will be asked to monitor students in the classroom while they are playing, watching a movie, playing on the computer, or working on homework, and cleaning the Extended Care room after the students leave. The compensation for each position is \$10 per hour. Benefits are not included. Each person will also be compensated to complete 18 continuing education clock hours each year to keep our AZ ECM (Early Childhood Ministries) license current. Because of the nature of the position, the applicant needs to be a person who shares the same faith, values, outlook, and purpose of our church and school.
