
30What shall we say then? That Gentiles, who were not pursuing righteousness, have obtained righteousness, a righteousness that is by faith. 31But Israel, while pursuing the law as a way of righteousness, did not reach it. 32Why? Because they kept pursuing it not by faith, but as if it comes by works. They stumbled over the stumbling stone. 33Just as it is written: Look, I am putting a stone in Zion over which they will stumble and a rock over which they will fall. The one who believes in him will not be put to shame. 10:1Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God on behalf of the Israelites is that they may be saved. 2Indeed, I testify about them that they have a zeal for God, but it is not consistent with knowledge. 3Since they were ignorant of the righteousness from God and sought to establish their own righteousness, they did not submit to the righteousness from God. 4For to everyone who believes, Christ is the end of the law, resulting in righteousness.

## Gospel - Luke 19:41-48

41As he came near, he saw the city and wept over it. 42He said, "If you, yes you, had only known on this day the things that would bring peace to you. But now, it is hidden from your eyes. 43In fact, the days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you, surround you, and hem you in on every side. 44Within your walls, they will dash you and your children to the ground. And within your walls, they will not leave one stone on top of another, because you did not recognize the time when God came to help you." 45Jesus entered the temple courts and began to drive out those who were selling things there. 46He told them, "It is written, 'My house will be a house of prayer,' but you have made it a 'den of robbers'!" 47Every day he was teaching in the temple courts, but the chief priests, the experts in the law, and the leaders of the people continued to look for a way to put him to death. 48They could not find any way to do it, because all the people were clinging to him and listening.

## First Lesson - Jeremiah 7:1-11

4Tell them, "This is what the LORD says: Do people fall and not get up again? Does someone turn away and not turn back? 5Then why has this people turned away? Why is Jerusalem always turning away? They take hold of deceit and refuse to turn back. 6I have paid attention and listened, but they do not say what is right. No one repents of his wickedness, asking, "What have I done?" Everyone pursues his own course like a horse charging into battle. 7Even the stork in the sky knows her seasons. The turtledove, the swallow, and the crane observe the time of their migration. But my people do not know the judgment of the LORD. 8"How can you say, 'We are wise, and the law of the LORD is with us'? But look, the lying pen of the experts in the law has produced falsehood? 9The wise men will be put to shame. They will be dismayed and trapped. Look, they have rejected the word of the LORD! What kind of wisdom do they have? 10That is why I will give their wives to other men and their fields to new owners, because, from the least to the greatest, all of them are greedy for dishonest profit. From prophet to priest, everyone practices deceit. 11They dress the wound of my dear people as if it is not serious, 'Peace, peace,' they say, when there is no peace. 12Are they ashamed when they do such a detestable thing? No, they have no shame at all. They do not even know how to blush. That is why they will fall among the fallen. They will be brought down when I punish them, says the LORD."
